
Historic fishing town

Mori Town boasts a distinctive history, including events at the end of the Edo period and the Washinoki Site, a World Heritage-related asset. It has a thriving fishing industry and is the birthplace of ikameshi (rice-filled squid), a specialty of the area. The cherry blossom festival in spring involves as many as 1,000 blooming cherry trees.

Kikonai is a town served by the Hokkaido Shinkansen and South Hokkaido Railway. It offers numerous attractions, such as the Kanchu Misogi Festival (cold-water purification festival) with a history of more than 190 years, historical and cultural sites including the Kairin Maru warship that lies at Cape Saraki, and one of the most popular roadside rest areas in Hokkaido.

Setana Town has a long coastline facing the Sea of Japan. It is a treasure trove of marine products such as sea urchins and abalone, and is also rich in the bounty of the land, with many typical Hokkaido farms and ranches



Oshamambe Town has a thriving fishing industry that produces hairy crabs and scallons. The very nonular Kani-meshi crab rice ekiben (a box lunch sold on a train or at a station) was born in this town. Oshamambe Onsen, with its abundant hot springs, is another attraction. At Futamata Radium Onsen, you can see the world's most precious calcareous sinter dome.



This guiet town is located inland between the Sea of Japan and the Pacific Ocean. The clear streams that run through the town nurture Imakane Danshaku potatoes, the town's specialty, as well as provide fields for outdoor activities.



Yakumo is the only town in Japan that faces both the Pacific Ocean and the Sea of Japan, Visitors can enjoy marine products from the two oceans and magnificent nature, such as Panorama Park overlooking Funka Bay.



Okushiri Island is surrounded by clear, bright blue sea known as Okushiri blue. You can enjoy time on the island to your heart's content with fresh sea urchins, abalone, and other delicacies, as well as various marine leisure activities



Scenery of oddly shaped rocks and a varied coastline, including Cape Tatenosaki, also known as the Grand Canyon of the East, is overwhelming. The town is also famous for its giant Enkatsura tree, believed to be the home of the god of

The town offers diverse travel experiences: the sea area stretching along the Matsumae-Yagoshi Prefectural Natural Park, the southernmost park of its kind in Hokkaido; the forest area with Hokkaido's oldest hot springs and rich nature; and cuisine featuring Chinese chives and ovsters, which are specialties of the area.



Fukushima Town is the birthplace of two Yokozuna sumo wrestlers. Chiyonoyama and Chiyonofuji. In addition to the Yokozuna Memorial Museum (which shows the history of the two Yokozuna wrestlers) and the Seikan Tunnel Museum, visitors can take the highly popular Iwabe Cruise along the unspoiled and unexplored Iwabe Coast.

The Matsumae Domain was the northernmost domain in Japan. Visitors
